Robert Boonin Shares Perspectives on Key Labor and Employment Issues at Two Michigan Events

At the Institute of Continuing Education's (ICLE) 39th Annual Labor and Employment Law Symposium, held last month in Northville, Michigan, Boonin provided a comprehensive update on the latest developments and trends under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), and also served as a panelist for two sessions of "The Year in Review for Human Resource Professionals."
