### Dykema Wins New Sentencing For Georgia Death Row Inmate

**DETROIT** - The Georgia Supreme Court recently granted a new sentencing to death row inmate David Aaron Perkins based on ineffective counsel in his 1997 trial. Led by Patrick Hickey and Claire Harrison, a pro bono team of defense lawyers at national law firm Dykema has been representing Perkins in his appeals for more than a decade.

Perkins was convicted in Clayton County, Georgia for the 1995 murder of his neighbor, Herbert Ryals III, and was sentenced to death. The Georgia Supreme Court this month overturned that sentencing and sent the case back for a new penalty trial on the basis of an abundance of mitigation evidence Dykema lawyers uncovered which was not presented during the 1997 trial. The ruling detailed numerous accounts from relatives who said Perkins' father regularly beat him from the time he was a young child until early adulthood. The court said that even more powerful than the evidence of the abuse Perkins suffered as a youth was evidence showing how his behavior changed dramatically after he suffered two significant head injuries.

"When David was 18, he was in a car wreck that left him in a coma for five days. When he was 20, he was attacked by two men who punctured his skull and brain with the steel prongs of a rake. The Court has finally affirmed that if the evidence of these traumatic head injuries, coupled with a lifetime of physical abuse, were presented at trial, there is a reasonable probability the jury would not have sentenced Perkins to death. David's fight is not over but this is an important step and we will continue to pursue justice for him," said Dykema Litigation member Patrick Hickey.

#### **Dykema's Longstanding Commitment to Pro Bono**

Dykema believes the practice of law, especially in a large corporate firm, is a privilege that carries with it profound societal responsibilities.
